Focus on providing educational opportunities for the attendees.

Dig deeper with your content: provide attendees with information they can implement at home.

Plan a Q&A portion of your presentation.

Provide handouts and takeaways.

How to Submit a Proposal

Step 1: Complete the online Workshop Proposal Form

Step 2: Submit the Workshop Proposal Form no later than Friday, May 18, 2018.

Step 3: Qualify

Selection is based on meeting the workshop needs defined by the Speaker Engagement Committee and speakers' qualifications to present on the proposed subject matter. Our goal at AFBF is to provide balanced workshops that meet the variety of interests of convention attendees. We aim to provide specific, action-item focused workshops that provide attendees with knowledge they can take back and apply to their own operations and daily lives. Please keep in mind that the convention workshops must be issue oriented and content-rich. Workshops may not be used to sell products and services.*

Step 4: If your proposal is selected

- All proposals will be reviewed by the Speaker Engagement Committee. Decisions will be made and notifications will be e-mailed no later than August 2018, so no phone calls please.
- You will be promoted on the official Convention website and other social media platforms. You will gain valuable professional exposure and networking opportunities.
- Honoraria: AFBF looks for contributors who are willing to share their expertise without expectation of payment in the spirit of shared purpose.
- AFBF will provide complementary Annual Convention registration, including admission to the IDEAg Trade Show. Invitation only and ticketed events will not be included. Speaker guests will need to pay for their registration.
- AFBF will reimburse expenses for WORKSHOP SESSIONS ONLY consistent with applicable Federal and Congressional Ethics Rules. The following will be eligible for reimbursement: Coach-fare air transportation for one, reimbursement for ground transportation to and from the airport (receipts must be submitted to receive reimbursement), reimbursement for meals to exceed no more than \$65 per day (receipts must be submitted to receive reimbursement), and lodging for two nights at a hotel in the convention room block.
