NATIONAL P&E PROGRAM OF WORK AND INITIATIVES

Communicate, Collaborate and Influence Workshops

During the American Farm Bureau Convention, workshops planned by members of the AFBF P&E and Women's Leadership Committees offer Farm Bureau volunteers new ideas and networking opportunities. Maximizing Resources is a popular session presented by P&E that highlights successful state programs with an emphasis on outreach activities.

Field to Fork Face-Off Game

A fun, interactive game-show activity that encourages discussion about perceptions of food production.

Connecting to Agriculture

An online digital resource provides easy access to information about agriculture and related industries to help Farm Bureau members share with non-farmers about where their food comes from and the value of the 21 million Americans engaged in the agricultural workforce.

Noah's Bandage Project

This project creates an opportunity to connect with pediatric cancer patients and their care providers while donating fun bandages, a by-product of agriculture. P&E is a champion of this program, which was started by Noah Wilson. Just as Noah's family embraced his spirit, Farm Bureau members rallied behind collecting and delivering more than 14,000 bandage boxes in less than six months. They continue to collaborate and partner with this cause.



FUSION Conference & Target Training

Each spring, leadership development and networking opportunities are offered to members. In odd years Promotion & Education volunteers join Young Farmers & Ranchers and Women's Leadership volunteers in planning and implementing the FUSION Conference. In even years, P&E hosts Target Engagement Training at different locations around the country. Registration to both conferences is open to all members.

AFBF P&E Committee and Appointment Process

Members of AFBF's P&E Committee are nominated by the state Farm Bureau, appointed by the AFBF president and confirmed by the AFBF board of directors for a two-year term. Committee nominees must be actively engaged with a qualified state Farm Bureau P&E program.
